Pasco County Orientation Day August 13th

Anclote High School invites students and their families to take a tour of the school, pick up course schedules, and pay student fees during Pasco County's Orientation Day, Tuesday, August 13th from 8:00–1:00. Student emergency cards will be completed in the cafeteria prior to obtaining student schedules. After paying student fees, students will be able to rent lockers and apply for parking tags. Information on athletics, clubs and extra curricular activities will also be available for students. Staff will be available on this date to assist families in completing the 2013–14 Free and Reduced-Price Meal Application. Schedules will not be available for pick up outside of this date and time. Students who are unable to pick up their schedules during this designated time must wait until the first day of school. We look forward to seeing you soon!

School Lunches

The District School Board of Pasco County's policy for free and reduced-priced meals and meal prices was approved for the 2013–2014 school year. Families <u>MUST</u> complete a new Free and Reduced-Price Meal Application for the upcoming school year. Families can apply online by visiting the Food and Nutrition Services Department website at www.pasco.k12.fl.us/nutrition/free_reduced; or applications will be available on August 1, 2013 from any Pasco County school cafeteria or administration office, at student orientation, and throughout the school year. A new family application MUST be submitted at the start of each new school year. Last year's meal eligibility status will expire after the first ten days of school. My College and Career Resources Blog, found at http://connect.pasco.k12.fl.us/glanders/ – This site will provide an overview of the services and options available to students and families, along with tips on how to navigate the transition process. There's help finding scholarships, preparing for college testing and requirements for entry into college, along with information on community service and employment assistance using local agencies.

Student Expectations

ELECTRONIC DEVICES

Students are expected to follow the district electronic use policy. It is the expectation of Anclote High School that all electronic devices remain off and out of sight throughout the school day unless authorized for classroom educational purposes, as determined by the teacher. In addition, students will be permitted to access personal electronic devices during the lunch period.

DRESS CODE

Students and parents are encouraged to review the District School Board of Pasco County's Rules of Dress and Appearance in the Student Code of Conduct. The following are common violations and should be reviewed with students prior to the start of school.

- tops must have strap/sleeve of at least three fingers in width
- shorts and skirts must be of modest length (modest length will be considered at the end of a student's fingertips when arms are at their sides, in a relaxed position)
- blouses, shirts, and sweaters cannot dip below a line formed between the right and left armpit (this includes, front, back, and sides of garments)

A student in violation of the dress code will be required to change into appropriate clothing before returning to class. If necessary, the student will contact parents to provide the appropriate clothing. Failure to do so, or repeated violations, will result in a discipline referral.

FOOD/DRINKS/HATS

Parents and students are reminded Anclote High School is a closed campus. Students are not permitted to leave for lunch. In addition, meals may not be brought to students during the school day. If an emergency arises, please contact the front office to make necessary arrangements.

Anclote High School is a hat free campus. At stated in the District Code of Conduct, students shall not wear hats or head coverings on the school campus during the regular school day unless previously approved for medical or religious reasons or special school activities as determined by the principal.

Parents are asked to review these expectations with their students prior to the start of the school year. Your support is greatly appreciated.

LOP LIST

AHS will be maintaining a LOP (Loss of Privilege) List related to unexcused absences. As stated in the District Code of Conduct, if a student has unexcused absences in 3 or more periods a day in five or more days, or 5 unexcused absences in any one course within a quarter or ten (10) unexcused absences in any one course within a semester, the student may lose the privilege of participating in extracurricular activities until the end of the following quarter. In addition, the privilege to drive to campus may be revoked until the end of the following grading quarter. Additional clarification on LOP is located in the General Information section of the newsletter.

Ready for the First Day of School?

Here are the answers to some frequently asked questions...

Q: Where does my student go on the first day of school?

A: Lists of first period classes will be posted in the commons areas. Students will report to the indicated room to receive a copy of their new schedule. Some students received a tentative schedule on orientation day and may experience changes in their schedule. Numerous schedules are adjusted to balance classes in attempt to meet the mandates of Florida's Class Size Amendment. All students must follow the new schedule received on the first day of school.

Q: How can I find my student's bus schedule?

A: Your student's bus assignment will be indicated on the class schedule received orientation day. Bus schedules will also be available on the district website at www.pasco.k12.fl.us.

Q: Does my student really need to take a class in order to get a parking permit?

A: Yes. All students interested in driving to school must complete a Safe Driving course available through the Sheriff's Department. Students will only be issued a parking permit after attending the class. More information is available through Corporal Winthrop, our School Resource Officer.

Q: What if my student has a schedule problem?

A: A schedule help table will be located in the gym during orientation day. School staff will be available to answer questions and address concerns on this date. Corrections, when appropriate and possible, will be made prior to the first day of school.

Q: What if my student does not like the schedule?

A: Each spring, students and parents are involved in the selection of classes for the coming year. Students were expected to choose their courses very carefully after discussions with their teachers, counselors, and parents. As a result, very few schedule changes will be approved. Anclote High School's Master Schedule has been developed based on student requests. Due to the Florida state-mandated Class Size Amendment, schedule change requests will be granted on a limited basis during the 2013-14 school year. The following circumstances will result in an approved schedule change:

- student already received credit for a course
- student does not meet the prerequisite for a course
- senior student requires a course for graduation

Every effort was made to give students the courses selected during online registration. However, not all students were able to receive their chosen electives. Other changes were made based on student data.

Q: When can my student see a guidance counselor?

A: Counselors will be registering new students on Orientation Day. Students who are already registered can schedule an appointment with their counselor through the guidance secretary in Student Services beginning the second week of school.

Q: Why does my student have an Intensive Reading class?

A: Students are assigned to reading classes based on a variety of data, including FCAT scores. These classes are required by state law and cannot be waived.

Q: Why does my Senior have an English/Math class they didn't choose?

A: The state of Florida has passed legislation requiring seniors who have not demonstrated post-secondary readiness through PERT/SAT/ACT be placed in English 4 College Prep and/or Math for College Readiness to receive additional academic support.

COMMUNICATION: STAY CONNECTED

At Anclote High School we understand the importance good communication plays in the successful education of our students. It is our goal to communicate with parents in a variety of formats, including newsletters, eSembler, School Connects, and our school website. In order to assist us in this process, please be sure to update your contact information as changes occur. Parents can contact Anclote High School's data entry operator at 246–3006 to change or verify contact information.

ESEMBLER

The best method of communication is through the use of eSembler where families can monitor student academic progress as well as attendance. eSembler also provides a convenient way to email teachers with questions or concerns. Once school starts visit Anclote High School's website at http://ahs.pasco.k12.fl.us for directions on how to set up an eSembler account and stay connected to your student's performance.

General Information

ATTENDANCE

Regular attendance is one of the most important factors in making good grades. It is also an important quality for success in the job market. All absences are considered unexcused unless the student presents an excused note to the front office within 2 school days of the absence. Students must submit a note signed by a parent/guardian stating student name (first and last), reason for and date of absence, and phone number of parent/guardian to the front office. An excused absence allows the student to make up work at full credit. Following an excused absence, a student will have two school days to request make-up work.

LOSS OF PRIVILEGE

In an effort to support the significant roll attendance plays in academic performance, Anclote High School will be enforcing a Loss of Privilege system. Pasco County School District outlines procedures whereby students lose the privilege of participating in extra-curricular activities and/or events based on attendance. These include but are not limited to field trips, dances, special events, club activities and participation in athletics and interscholastic extracurricular activities. Interscholastic extracurricular activities are those organized student activities between, among or within schools that are carried on outside the curriculum or regular course of study in school. These activities may involve displays of talent that include, but are not limited to, sports, speech, debate, and fine arts interscholastic competitions or festivals and career and technical student organization activities.

EARLY DISMISSAL

When a student must be released early from school, the student will need to:

• Bring a signed note from home stating the reason for the dismissal, requested release time, and a phone number where the parent/guardian may be reached for verification.

- Present the note to Student Services PRIOR to the start of school. Notes presented just prior to the dismissal time may need to wait for verification before dismissal.
- A parent/guardian or other authorized person must sign out students in Student Services or, in the case of illness, the clinic.
- Students are to wait in the office until their ride arrives and they have been signed out appropriately.
- Parents are not authorized to give students permission to leave campus without following proper sign-out procedures. Students leaving campus without following sign-out procedures may be subject to disciplinary action.

SENIOR GRADUATION INFO

Balfour will be on campus during the student orientation day for students who would like to order their graduation cap and gown. The cost will be \$70, which includes cap, gown, tassel, medallion, and graduation expenses.

VIRTUAL SCHOOL/DUAL ENROLLMENT

Students interested in participating in alternative course options such as FLVS, e-School, or dual enrollment as part of their regular school day must meet with a guidance counselor. Parents and students must then return the signed Virtual School/Dual Enrollment agreement along with a schedule change request. Requests for alternative course options will be reviewed on an individual basis. Students are to follow their assigned schedule unless a new schedule is approved and provided to the student.

PARKING

Parking in a school lot is a privilege. Students will park only in lots designated as student parking and will display a current parking permit. Vehicles that are not registered or that are inappropriately or illegally parked, or parked so as to cause a safety hazard, may be warned, booted, or towed at the owner's

expense. Students are not permitted in the parking lot during the school day. Anclote High School is a closed campus. Students are not allowed to leave campus during the school day without permission. Students who leave campus without permission will be subject to disciplinary action. A vehicle, upon reasonable suspicion, may be searched for weapons, drugs, or other items which are illegal, or against School Board policy. If any of these items are found in the car, appropriate legal action will be taken and the parking permit will be revoked.

LOCKERS

Lockers with combination locks will be issued through student services during the first week of school to those who pay the locker fee. Students are not allowed to change the locks unless approved by administration. Lockers are issued for the storing of school supplies only, and routine inspection of lockers can be expected. The school is not responsible for items in the lockers. Students who share their locker or who give their locker combination to others will be held responsible for lost/stolen items, including textbooks. All physical education clothing must be kept in P.E. lockers.

LUNCHES

FREE breakfast is served daily in the cafeteria from 7:10-7:25. Lunch is served daily in the cafeteria. All students can purchase their lunch in one of the serving lines in the cafeteria. Eating areas are available in the main cafeteria, the patio area located adjacent to the main cafeteria, and the picnic area. Anclote High School is a closed campus. Students are not allowed to leave for lunch. In addition, meals may not be brought to students during the school day. If an emergency arises, please contact Student Services to make necessary arrangements.
