Please note – the following list is NOT all-inclusive! This is only a compilation of scholarship information received by the school. Please be sure to check this list AT LEAST monthly, as new scholarships may be added! Also, remember to check with the office of financial aid at the institutions to which you are applying. There are many school-specific scholarships and grants available this way. Virtually every college has a section of their website dedicated to scholarships available at their school. If you need assistance finding this information, you can contact the school or see me for guidance.

The federal government requires the filing of a FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) to consider students for aid. Many other scholarships also require this form be on file. This CANNOT be filed before October 1 but must be completed as soon as possible after that date. Please plan now by logging into www.fafsa.gov for further information.

The Gates Scholarship

The Gates Scholarship is a highly selective, last-dollar scholarship for exceptional, Pell-eligible, minority, high school seniors. Starting in 2018, the scholarship will be awarded to 300 top student leaders each year with the intent of promoting their academic excellence through college graduation, and providing them the opportunity to reach their full potential.

Eligibility requirements:

- A high school senior
- From at least one of the following ethnicities: African American, American Indian/Alaska Native*, Asian/Pacific Islander American, and/or Hispanic American
- Pell-eligible
- A US citizen, national, or permanent resident
- A minimum cumulative weighted GPA of 3.3 on a 4.0 scale

Additionally, a student must plan to enroll full-time, in a four-year degree program, at a US, accredited, not-for-profit, private or public college or university.

Will Mclean Foundation Scholarship Application

Golden Door Scholarship for DACA recipients.

Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) is an <u>American immigration policy</u> that allows some individuals with unlawful presence in the United States after being brought to the country as children to receive a renewable two-year period of <u>deferred action</u> from <u>deportation</u> and become eligible for a <u>work permit</u> in the U.S.

Eligibility requirements:

Seniors who will attend college in the fall of 2020, who are interested in pursuing a bachelor's degree. In addition to funding, Golden Door provides 1:1 mentorship, professional development opportunities, and summer internships. They currently support 293 students and have 67 graduates who are working or pursuing a Masters or PHD. (Scholarship will also include undocumented students without DACA)

Deadline to apply: The due date for applications is Monday, September 30th.
